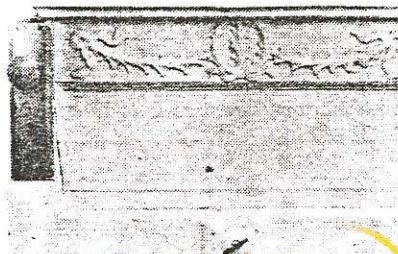

at 305 Jerry "Howe Home" in memory of the family occupying the house for the longest period of time. However, official records also indicate that Samuel and Esther Dyer, Wallace Holcomb, William Whitney, and several Wolfensbergers also owned the land and/or building since the original title deed was issued in 1880. The original structure probably was a two-story rectangular clapboard frame house built in approximately 1902. It had a gable roof and faced east. Additions appear to have been built on the south, west and north sides. A hip roof covers the front porch. Note two courses of brick sticking out on the chimney for an example of a "creative flair" added by one of the owners. Also note the decorative molding on the front door along with the older style of door bell and turned posts underneath the porch roof.



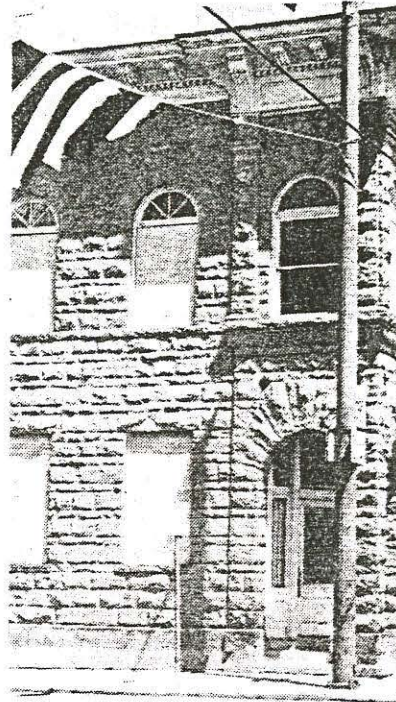
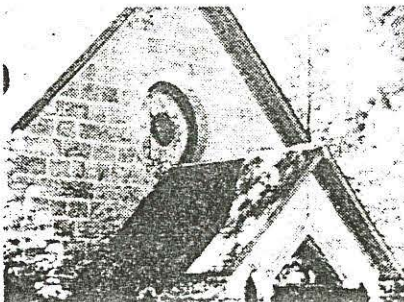
#### 7. Harry Jones' House - 118 3rd

Early-day Douglas County treasurer Harry Jones once lived in the house at 118 3rd and probably would be pleased to know that it now serves as a land office for Western Title Corporation.



#### 8. St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church - 3rd and Jerry Streets

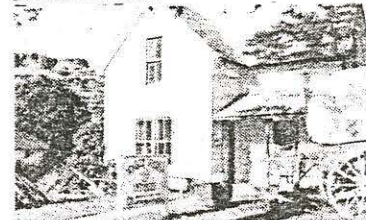
Now known as The Stone Church, a restaurant and bar, the church at the corner of 3rd and Jerry Streets was built in 1888 and was Castle Rock's first church. St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church. German born stonemason John Baptiste Ehmanon built the church as well as helping with the old Courthouse. His funeral service was held in the church in 1909. Early supporters of the church were the Winklers, the Ehmanns and the Doeckes. Father Dezonias Streidle served for 37 years in this area and was known as the



#### 14. Wagon Wheel Antiques - 502 Wilcox

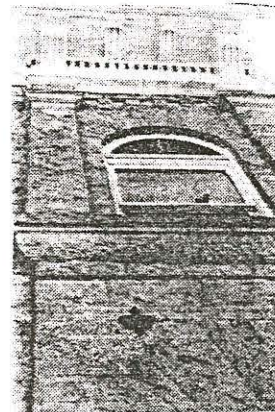
Known as one of the first houses in Castle Rock, the building at 502 Wilcox now used as an antique shop. History students attempted to locate date of the construction of the building and all owners, the only information were able to find was that the house was owned by Mildred M. Pottenger in 1910 and sold to John Breus the same day he bought it from J. Frank Kendal.

The small house was built on a corner foundation with a wood frame and porches. It had a gable roof and a basement, probably a root cellar. Asbestos cement sheets covered the sides. The interior had six rooms, electric lights, an automatic water heater, and a contained attic.



#### 15. Claudia's Cupboard Antiques - 522 V

Note the chimney treatments, decorated with varying levels of brick other protected by a metal spark cap used to prevent roof fires. This building has a basic design similar to the building on the other side of the school at Wilcox. Even though the porches are different, the houses are similar in roof, windows and dormers.



#### 11. B & B Cafe - 322 Wilcox Street

In 1943, Main Street was changed to Lewis Street in honor of Town Marshall Ray Lewis who was shot and killed by a young boy hiding from the police. The shooting took place in the B & B Cafe when Lewis attempted to apprehend the fugitive.

Note the pressed-tin ceiling and inlaid marble surrounding the mirror and fountain area. Lighting fixtures also date back to an early design popular during the first days of electrical illumination.
