The community was shocked and saddened Thursday night when Ray Lewis was shot and killed as he attempted to stop Manuel Perez, 18, from leaving the B. and B. Café in Castle Rock. The youth has been hunted by Denver police and state enforcement officers since Monday night when he shot and wounded two Denver policemen.

Perez had evidently become very hungery and went into the café to obtain some food. Mr. Lewis and several other citizens of Castle Rock recognized him and Undersheriff Duncan Lowell was called, but before he arrived, Perez started to leave and Mr. lewis attempted to stop him when he pulled his gun and shot Mr. Lewis. Martin "Boots" Nelson, Dale Ridenour and Gene dodge jumped on Perez, taking his gun away and kept him until the officers arrived. "Boots" received a bullet wound in one of his hands.

Mr. Lewis has been Town Marshall for a number of years. He has lived in Castle Rock

since he was a young man, is married and has four
